Notes:

Joan has been investigating possible costs for distributing the newsletter. The Parish Council uses a company (Abacus). They will only distribute to entire roads, but have very competitive prices. General consensus it will be OK to distribute slightly beyond the bounds of the Parish rather than try to cover the split roads precisely- will help meet our obligation to engage with bordering neighbourhoods.

We will include pricing estimates for several mailshots in our budget- this will be used in funding applications so we need it soon.

Agreed that rather than wait until all our newsletter articles are ready before publishing anything, we will instead focus on delivering a stream of news articles online. At regular intervals we will print a digest of recent news for distribution across the Parish to ensure everyone gets at a chance to see something from us, whether online or in print.

Discussion, with several good ideas for expanding the concept of a photography competitionwe need to make more progress on turning this into reality.

We need a policy/procedure for press releases and communication. Lynda and Kevin will work on this.

A suggestion that at our next meeting we will have a short demonstration of "Slack" (the messaging app for teams- http://tpcnp.slack.com/)

Fred will research recording tools for future meetings.
