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

About Neighbourhood Plans


- Neighbourhood Planning was introduced in the 2010 Localism Act
- A Neighbourhood Plan gives communities the right to plan for their local areas
- It allows us to set the future for:

 - Choosing where new homes, shops, offices and businesses will be built
 - How we grow our roads, water and sewerage systems
 - Protecting what we value about our area and what we want to see in the future

What's in it for Tilehurst?

- We can make local planning decisions based on the needs of the community
- A green and light touch to influence planning decisions
- The community benefits from an increase in revenue from the "Community Infrastructure Levy" (CIL)
- We can identify and prioritise local projects we want to see funded and implemented
